

## Summary of RCGP Minimum requirements & Good Practice from COGPED Guidance

Evidence	RCGP Requirement	Good Practice
<b>WPBA Assessments</b>	<a href="http://www.rcgp.org.uk/training-exams/mrcgp-workplace-based-assessment-wpba.aspx">http://www.rcgp.org.uk/training-exams/mrcgp-workplace-based-assessment-wpba.aspx</a>	Regularly completed during placement 1 x CSR in each hospital post – important if in a short placement
<b>LLE - Validation</b>	Sufficient number & quality to confirm progress	ES to write a comment justifying/explaining the competence linkage
<b>LLE</b>	Demonstrate regular reflective practice	LLE should be shared on a regular basis, be broad in range of LLE categories & should generally meet the RCGP guide to a good log entry.
<b>PDP</b>	Reflective, living document to show planning of learning needs to incorporate that identified by ES	At least 1 entry every 6 months in addition to those agreed by ES At final ARCP there should be objectives relating to independent practice and post CCT
<b>Child Protection: Level 3</b>	The GMC have published guidance on Safeguarding children – it is a professional duty to be trained to level 3 in child protection	Trainees should highlight the agreed evidence for child protection in TeP and at final CCT ESR trainers will tick the box (agreed evidence). Trainee must show some practical application of theoretical knowledge
<b>SEA</b>	Regularly contribute to adverse event recognition, perform SEA & reflect in TeP.	Show evidence of ongoing SEA activity during each 6 months of GP
<b>CEPS</b>	Full range of sensitive clinical examinations (breast, female & male genital exam inc. rectal, prostate, pelvic exam)	Reflective LLE sufficient to demonstrate competence. Additionally, assessment of CEPS by supervisors & colleagues (ST4 & above) may be included
<b>Audit</b>	You must take part in QA & QI – must be able to conduct an audit	Complete an audit cycle -with personal input - in GP or provide clear alternative evidence to satisfy curriculum & revalidation needs during current training
<b>AKT</b>	Pass	Pass
<b>CSA</b>	Pass	Pass
<b>CPR/AED</b>	Certificated evidence of current CPR/AED	Regular updating of skills as some certification does not last long
<b>OOH</b>	Completion of OOH sessions (~ 4-6 hours) in 18 months in GP (36 hours in GPST1: 72 hours in GPST3)	Each OOH has reflective log entry, plus copy of OOH record completed at the time of the session – scanned and uploaded to a LLE
<b>Revalidation</b>	Completion of Form R, & in Scotland SOAR declarations. The GMC have stated failure to do this will result in an unsatisfactory Outcome at ARCP	Absence documentation, & SOAR declarations, completed by Trainees by the date set by local administrators in preparation for the ARCP panel.
<b>Trainee Survey</b>	<b>GMC</b> requirement that all trainees engage in this process	Undertake annual GMC survey & Scottish Trainee Survey upload evidence of completion
